ARTIST PROFILE 2012 - SUZY TILLEY



We asked Suzy to speak of when she joined us, why art and if her style has developed? She was asked to speak of her experience with Splashout. Here are her thoughts: -

'As one of the longest members of Splashout, I joined in 2003. What made me start painting? Truth was I have always loved my art, but had not followed through since 1974 when I did 6 months under the guidance of Arthur Phillips. I wanted to fill my house with original paintings.

I then got full time work, so the brushes were put away until I had time again in 2003 and needed some relaxation. I joined Splashout and painted again. How I loved this opportunity to create and put some of my passion for life down on canvas.

Splashout is just an amazing place to paint, not only are the other clients also full of passion for the art that they produce, but the co-owners are two delightful women who share more than the love of art with you, they share life experiences.

Over the years of my involvement with Krysh and Jenny we have formed a long lasting friendship, and the mentoring they have both given me in the techniques of art, and life, I am grateful for.

Have I developed a style during my time at Splashout? I am not sure enough to say yes on my own behalf, but I am told by others that they immediately know when a painting on the wall is a Suzy Tilley (important because many times I forget to sign my work)! My style changes so much with each painting, it is interesting that others find my work so recognizable.

Every time I attend a group at Splashout I learn something, whether it be sharing ideas, information, and in particular the painting projects. I feel I am always moving forward. Over the years I have watched so many other clients join the Splashout community and each and everyone has progressed enormously, from beginners to fully fledged artists.

THE YEAR IN BRIEF

'During 2012, "Splashout Tours" took to the road and a group of ten went to Sydney in March for the Picasso Exhibition at the Gallery of New South Wales.

In April/May a group of twelve flew to France. We landed in Paris and flew down to Nice. We travelled the Cote d' Azur and the French Riviera, lunching by the shores of the Mediterranean Sea. Then onto Provence, painting at the foot of Mont Victoire, Paul Cezanne's favourite subject. The group visited the studio of Cezanne and then hopped on a train to Paris where we spent several days visiting the significant galleries and viewing some of the finest works ever produced by all the Great Masters. The trip ended with a day in Giverny, 80 kms from Paris where we delighted in the ambience of Claude Monet's garden, house and his enormous studio.

On returning home, Splashout proceeded as normal and even more great works were created, this time here in sunny Marino, where clients worked diligently with Krysh, producing some fabulous work throughout the year. Thanks also to guest artists, Lauryn Arnott and Cat Leonard for some great workshops. More in 2013.

In November, a group of twelve spent a weekend painting en plein air at the Nairne Weekend Art/Meditation Retreat. A wonderful time was had by all and fabulous works were produced in spite of the high temperatures.

A peak into the future looks forward to 2013 where in February we open again with a full house. Classes are almost full, so much so we have added two new time slots - a second beginners on a Monday

evening and another general painting on a Tuesday evening. In an effort to allow Krysh to have the odd moment off, we have enlisted the help of Di Lamont who will facilitate these two new groups and we welcome Di to the Splashout team. Our special thanks go to Gaynor Jarvis who every Wednesday morning thrills us with her skills and creativity at the computer.
